12	Now we will have the DHCD updates.
13	MS. ESTRADA: Can you see the PowerPoint
14	presentation? Can you all see the screen?
15	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKERS: No. No.
16	Yeah, can now.
17	Yeah, can see it now.
18	MS. ESTRADA: Okay. (Indiscernible) see how it
19	will work there. Sorry.
20	Okay. I'm Stephani Estrada, program manager
21	for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, and this is

January's Commission meeting to discuss the program revenue updates.

(Indiscernible).

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What?

MS. ESTRADA: Okay. We'll go through the Trust Fund revenue, the commitments and expenditures, and the Trust Fund's activities.

(Indiscernible).

All right. So this is the revenue to date that has been collected. December we received \$418,046.

Revenue collected to date is 78 million, 424 thousand,

530 -- 553 dollars. Revenue for FY '24 is 10,088,453.

This is the type by year through December of '23. FY '24 we have received \$3,088,453 in tax revenue, and 7 million for City's contribution. Again, this has not fully been confirmed. So far they, they have not said that it's going to be lower, but I'm still waiting for a goal from fiscal.

Fund source revenue amount. Total to date is -- total tax revenue collected to date is 53,174,548.

The City's contribution is \$25,250,005. Again, that's if

1 | we get the 7 million.

This is the commitments and expenditures. I had to do a correction from the last meeting for the CLT projects commitments. The expended to date was -- is actually 1.9. In the last month I had 2.5.

The rest of this is pretty much the same. Our senior homeownership did not -- I do not have an update for January. So that amount is still the same from last month that was good through December.

The other changes, administration cost which that increased to 2.6 million.

This is the project status. There we go.

Project status; awards to date is 49, due diligence 35,

final agreements drafted 28, audit review 21, audits

approved 20, BOE requested 20, 19 have been approved, and

10 have been disbursed, 3 are in compliance.

NOFA information for new construction. Rounds

1, 2, 3, and 4 are in the middle of deal structuring,

presenting agreements to the BOE for approval, and

preparing for settlement. Round 5 NOFA was up for public

comments. The public comments was expected up until

December the 19th. We drafted a public comment summary
that was sent around to all the Commissioners for their
review and comments. The NOFA Round 5 will open
February 2, 2024. DHCD will be making up to seven
million available. One million of that money will be set
aside for Community Land Trust projects.

Community Land Trust, Single-Family

Homeownership NOFA Rounds 1, 2, and 3. We're still in
the middle of deal structuring, presenting agreements to

BOE, and preparing for settlement.

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Community Land Trust Rental NOFA Round 1, that is still in the middle of deal structuring.

The Operating NOFA Round 1, all agreements have been approved by the BOE, and grantees are drawing down on the funds.

The Operating NOFA Round 2, we had kickoff meetings, and we are now in the middle of drafting grant agreements for BOE approval.

Community Land Trust Single-Family

Homeownership NOFA Round 4, the rolling NOFA opened on

June 30th. DHCD made up to four million available.

Community Land Trust projects can request up to one million per project. The NOFA will run until June 30, 2024, until the funds run out. If the funds don't run out, they will roll over to FY '25. The NOFA application — no application has been submitted. SHARE Baltimore is continuing to work with CLTs to how to work their submission.

For the Long-Term Voucher Program, DHCD is working on the RFP draft to request a consultant to help make a decision on what type of Long-Term Voucher Program we will go with. We will send the RFP draft around to the Commissioners for review, and discuss it in our next workgroup meeting before posting it. The proposed issue date is April 1, 2024.

The Affordable Housing Trust Fund Commission

Bylaws Meeting. We sent the draft out to everyone, and

Krystle sent out a message for the volunteers of the

workgroup to set up the first meeting. We can have two

more commissioners in this workgroup. Please send us

your -- and please send us your availability so that we

The Inclusionary Housing legislation was passed on January 22, 2024. The bill was unanimously approved by the Baltimore City Council.

If Matt or Tisha want to go into more detail about it, let me know.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: This is Tisha. The biggest update is that the bill was actually signed yesterday. The Mayor signed the bill. And it is definitely a momentous -- it was a momentous occasion. Councilperson Odette Ramos, who was -- as we have, been indicated was the quarterback for the bill. And this is really a significant step to undo a lot of the racial harm, and economic harm that's been done in Baltimore. So it is a, definitely a piece of this pipeline that we are trying to build in Baltimore.

Let me ask again. I know we talked about it before, but of course it's a new year. And I think I forgot everything from last year. I'm just kidding. The awarded 49, disbursed 10, and compliance 3. Just explain that. Explain that cycle for me again, and some of the, the challenges and opportunities that that presents in that, that process of awarded to disbursement to just three compliant.

MS. ESTRADA: Yes.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: What normally happens in that cycle?

MS. ESTRADA: So the awarded are probably still in the middle of due diligence. A lot of them are in the middle of due diligence where they are trying to get their funding sources together. And before they can draw down on the funds they have to have all their funding sources. The 10 that has been in disbursement --

construction, and they are able to draw down or they were 1 2 able to obtain the advancement money. So some of them 3 can get the advancement money without having all their 4 funding sources, but (indiscernible) predevelopment cost. 5 So for the most part a lot of them have not started 6 construction. So we wait until they get closer to 7 getting all their funding sources, and then we'll 8 (indiscernible) to BOE, and then once they go to closing on all of their fund's funds, then they can start drawing

Thank you, Stephani, for the report. I have a couple questions. One which I know you indicated you don't have an update for the, the commissioner seat representing on house population, but I'm wondering about the other seat that has been vacated for, well, over a year now, and that the individual at 30 percent AMI (indiscernible). Any update around that one?

MS. ESTRADA: I will follow-up with, with them,

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if they found anybody for that. But I believe they had someone for the seat, but then they just never showed up.

So commissioner seat for 30 percent AMI.

think I can speak on behalf of most of the Commissioners that that's -- it's definitely important to have as many seats as possible filled so that we have a great representation of the population that we -- that this Fund serves. So if the Commissioners, if we can be of any assistance with making recommendations or anything --

MS. ESTRADA: Oh, yeah, please, yes, um-hmm.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Thank you.

MS. ESTRADA: You can send me their information, and I can forward that.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Okay. Okay. The other question is with regards to the, the transaction report in the Department's report. Initially, we received a lot more information; namely, the amount for which the property sold, and the, the name of the property, and/or the address. And I'm just wondering what informed the change in that information that's being provided.

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MS. ESTRADA: I think it was the change the 1 2 Workday, and now the -- that whole transition into 3 Workday this is the report that kicks out now. I totally 4 agree. It's -- that the other report was way better than 5 this. I actually have a meeting coming up with BBMR, and so we can discuss on if there's a way to get a more 6 7 detailed report that is similar to the old report. 8 Because that was a better report. 9 COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yeah, yeah. Okay. 10 Thank you so much Stephani. 11 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any other questions 12 Commissioners? 13 If not -- there be none. I think we can open 14 -- is that -- did you raise your hand again, Commissioner Guthrie? 15 16 (No audible response.) 17 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Okay. If not, do we have 18 anybody for public comment? 19 MS. ESTRADA: I don't see anything in the chat. 20 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any other business to 21 discuss?

2	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: One thing I I'm
3	sorry. There is something I wanted to discuss. So I
4	know we're at a timeframe of trying to get the, the Long-
5	Term Voucher Program up and running by April, but I'm
6	wondering if there's any way that if there's anything
7	that we as a Commission can do to try and expedite that.
8	Even though the, the I keep hearing this information
9	in the, in the news that things are starting to
10	stabilize, but people's rent is still what it is. It's
11	still very expensive. There are a lot of people who are
12	struggling. There are people who are counted in the
13	numbers of unhoused, but I think we all know that they
14	are those numbers are also pretty inaccurate due to
15	people not being qualified by the, by the census way of
16	qualifying people as unhoused, people couch surfing, and
17	living in hotels and things like that. So I'm just
18	wondering if there's anything that we as a Commission can
19	do to expedite this. Because April is I mean, it may
20	sound it's around the corner to just, but for those who
21	are unhoused or unstably housed, it's, it's not.

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MS. ESTRADA: Yes -- no, I agree. And, really, Tisha, the, the April is to get the RFP out. So it may even be a little longer. The issue is that we, we don't have the capacity to do this program without some help from an outside source. And so that's why we're doing the RFP to get the consultant in here to give us some more guidance. There is nobody on our team that has ran a Long-Term Voucher Program. And so I think right now it's about getting the, the help that we need to, to get it up and running. And so, yeah, the, the RFP I actually will have a draft out to you guys hopefully by next week, and then we can actually -- we can discuss like if I captured everything that we're looking for in this RFP for the consultant in the workgroup meeting, and then after that Kate and Alice will go over, and then we can get this, the final draft, out so that we can get it out. I put April the 1st to give us some time, but it's possible to have the -- it posted sooner than that. really, that's just to get a consultant. So, no, I understand the, the urgency behind it, but I don't have anybody else that -- we don't have anybody that can take

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it on where they can actually run a whole program inside of DHCD right now. So definitely if the Commission has more guidance, we can talk further in the workgroup meeting. Because I believe Kate should be in attendance for that one. We can talk a little further into it, but, but now this is where we're at. We're just trying to get some professional help.

appreciate that. I mean, just, really, just to be on the record, it -- and I don't know if you want to comment on this, but it sounds like there's, there's a staffing issue that seems to be kind of a chronic, a chronic issue. And I feel like DHCD like you guys should have someone so you don't have to go through this rigmarole of constantly looking for a consultant or -- it's, it just, it seems like a, it seems like a, a lack of, a lack of having someone stably on staff. But I, I'm on the outside looking in.

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. I don't -- I'm not too sure about that. I don't think the, like, the Affordable Housing Trust Fund is to -- fund a lot of this, but the

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stuff that we administer our staff is proficient enough 1 to, to do our part. But this part is more like a -- some 3 of us are like the Senior Homeownership. Senior 4 Homeownership we actually just transfer the funds over to 5 that department, and then we can go (indiscernible) and 6 kind of go with that. But Baltimore City, as far as I'm 7 concerned, we don't have a local voucher program, and 8 that's why we're -- that's why we have to build it from scratch, and that's why a professional consultant needs

The other voucher program HABT and that is federally funded. So that's different. And our funds allow us to be a whole lot more flexible than the federal funds. So we've never had the program. So now it's just building it from scratch. And, yeah, we need some guidance. So, no, I don't think that we -- that we're not staffed well enough for it. I just think that there was never a program (indiscernible).
