COMMISSIONERS: Aye, aye, aye. 6 7 PRESIDENT DANIELS: The motion carries. Okay. Now we're just going to have some DHCD 8 9 updates. 10 MS. ESTRADA: Okay. Hi everyone. I'm 11 Stephani Estrada, Program Manager for the Affordable 12 Housing Trust Fund, and I'm going to give the DHCD 13 updates -- try to get this off the screen -- for February 27, 2024. 14 15 MS. ESTRADA: No. I'm going to just go through 16 it --17 Okay. First we'll do the Affordable Housing 18 Trust Fund revenue, the commitments and expenditures, and 19 the Trust Fund activities. 20 For January, we received \$501,206.96. Revenue

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collected to date is \$78,925,760. For FY '24,

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This is the total funds since inception. There has been \$53,675,755 were from tax revenue, and \$25,250,005, in City of Baltimore contributions. Again, the 7 million has not been confirmed for FY '24. So that may change.

This is the commitment and expenditures to date. This has not changed since the last round. I believe it's only a difference in senior homeownership which that has increased to 6.1 million, and that is good through actually January. That's actually good through January not December. And they have served 366 households.

These are project status. This is good through January as well. Awards to date have been 49 projects.

Due diligence is 35. We have -- we're still doing deal

1 | structuring for 35 of them. Rent agreements that have

- 2 | been drafted is 28. 21 have gone through audit review.
- 3 | 20 have audits approval. 20 have been BOE requested. 19
- 4 | have been approved. And 10 have started in
- 5 disbursements. Three are -- three projects are under
- 6 | compliance.
- 7 NOFA information. For the rental NOFA
- 8 Rounds 1, 2, 3 and 4, we're still in the middle of deal
- 9 structuring presenting agreements to BOE approval, and
- 10 preparing for settlement. Round 5, the NOFA opened
- 11 | February 2, 2024. DHCD will be making up to 7 million
- 12 | available. One million of that money will be set aside
- 13 | for Community Land Trust Rental Projects. And the NOFA
- 14 | deadline is March 19th at 4 p.m.
- 15 Community Land Trust, Single-Family
- 16 | Homeownership NOFA Rounds 1, 2 and 3 are deal
- 17 | structuring, presenting agreements to BOE approval, and
- 18 | preparing for settlement. Community Land Trust Rental
- 19 NOFA is in the middle of deal structuring. Operating
- 20 | NOFA Round 1, all agreements have been approved by the
- 21 | BOE. Operating NOFA Round 2, grant agreements have been

drafted, and preparing to go to the BOE.

The Community Land Trust Single-Family

Homeownership NOFA, Round 4, is a rolling NOFA that

opened on June 30th. DHCD gave up to 4 million. The

Community Land Trust projects can request up to 1 million

per project. The NOFA will run until June 30, 2024, or

until the funds run out. If there are funds left, it

will roll over to the next fiscal year. Two applications

have been submitted, and SHARE Baltimore continues to

work with CLTs to help with their submissions.

The Long-Term Voucher Program. DHCD sent a draft of the RFP around to the Commission to request a consultant to help make a decision on what type of Long-Term Voucher Program we will go with. DHCD and the Commission Workgroup met on February 22, 2024, to discuss possible changes and additions. Some of the suggestions were to see about doing both project-based and tenant-based vouchers, and giving the RFP out sooner. The proposed issue date is April 1, 2024, or sooner.

The approval of the Trust Fund Commission Bylaws. The first draft has been sent to all

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Commissioners for their review. Crystal sent out a message for volunteers of the Workgroup to set up the first meeting. A poll was sent out on Friday, the 23rd for you all to send your availability. We can have one more Commissioner on this Workgroup. Please fill out the poll soon as you can.

For Inclusionary Housing. Inclusionary Housing legislation was passed on January 22, 2024. The bill was unanimously approved by the Baltimore City Council. The Inclusionary Housing Policy will go into effect 180 days from the date that the Mayor signs the bill into law.

If any Commissioner wants to give additional updates, they can definitely -- between Tisha and Matt. So we'll wait on that.

Commissioner nomination updates. The

Commission is still working with MOHS to identify a

representative from the Continuum of Care, and I don't

have any updates since the last one on that.

COMMISSIONER HARRIS: Yeah, I think that the, the -- for the, for the Q&A and dialog, I think that when we talked about the -- we had a special meeting about --

We did 8 have a, we did have a brief meeting on last week about the Long-Term Voucher Program, and I think that we said 10 that we were looking -- we were going to try to look into 11 Stephani to see whether or not we can move those dates up 12 because we do have a -- I think we have a June -- we have 1.3 a June --14 MS. ESTRADA: Hold on one second. 15 (Aside comments and technical issues.) 16 COMMISSIONER HARRIS: Okay. So we did talk 17 about the Long-Term Voucher Program and the, the timeline 18 for getting a consultant in to run that process. 19 we talked about -- I think at this point we talked about 20 it coming to fruition by June. Is that --21 MS. ESTRADA: Oh, well, we, we want to get the

RFP out by April 1st, but if we can get it sooner. So maybe like mid-March.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Okay.

MS. ESTRADA: And that's depending on once we get the edits and stuff back. And it's still kind of hard to hear you Kevin.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: It's still hard. Okay.

You want me to come over there?

MS. ESTRADA: Okay. Yeah. Come over here because she said she could couldn't hear (indiscernible).

were just talking about we did have the meeting last week to talk about the, the (indiscernible) for the consultant for the Long-Term Voucher Program. And right now we're looking to get the RFP out by April with a possible start date of June. I think it was -- I think some of the Commissioners wanted to see if we could get it a bit earlier than that. So and I think that's still out on the table. And we'll have a fuller discussion about that. I just wanted to kind of convey that those were some of the things that came up. And I see Bree, I think

- 17 MS. ESTRADA: Okay.
- 18 | COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: So (indiscernible) one
- 19 of the things that (indiscernible) that's a key part of
- 20 | the program (indiscernible).
- 21 MS. ESTRADA: Okay, yep. Once you get your

edit, and we can discuss a little further. We can do a call as soon as you get finished. Like we can set something up either by end of this week or early next week based off of your availability kind of go through it.

COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: Yes (indiscernible).

COMMISSIONER HARRIS: I think that we, I think when we talked about, I think that we talked about whether or not -- what was the -- even in getting, possibly trying to get it earlier? I think there was a conversation about what could be some of the other kind of roadblocks.

MS. ESTRADA: Oh, just seeing if we could do both voucher programs. So like the project-based and the tenant voucher so we can have our consultant look further into that if it's possible to do both with the money that we have set aside for (indiscernible) support.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Okay.

MS. ESTRADA: So just kind of like putting that in there for them to be aware that we want them to research both programs, and possibly see how --

1 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Okay. 2 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. 3 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any other comment for the Commission or for the DHCD? Any other Commissioner have, 4 5 have anything for the DHCD? 6 Okay. Now we're going to open it for public 7 discussion, public comment. 8 MS. ESTRADA: Do we have any public comments? 9 MS. GREENE: I first would like to introduce 10 who we are. 11 MS. ESTRADA: Sure. 12 MS. GREENE: Is that okay? 13 MS. ESTRADA: Sure. 14 MS. GREENE: We're here from Saint John A.M.E. 15 Church. And we're interested in providing a housing 16 program for a building that we have, a vacant building 17 that we have. So just in conjunction with the question I 18 have --19 I'm Debra Keller Greene. This is Domenika 20 Ringold. And this is Timothy Johnson who (indiscernible)

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associate pastor. So and so my question is will we be

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looking at a, a project-based? I mean, we're interested in the --

MS. ESTRADA: In the vouchers?

MS. GREENE: In vouchers, yes. And so it's -the question is will it be -- would that program be
considered a project-based or a tenant? What's the
difference between a project-based and a tenant-based? I
guess that's --

MS. ESTRADA: So the project-based vouchers are attached to like a project (indiscernible) if you have a, let's say a 20-unit building, and you want to set aside maybe 10 of those units, as for affordable housing, you - the way you want to set it up is that you'll be able to apply for our NOFA funding for that project, and then at the same time apply for vouchers. So if you (indiscernible) 30 percent below (indiscernible). But the voucher program isn't up and running yet. That's what we're talking about now that we're doing auditing to get a professional (indiscernible) so that hopefully will not (indiscernible) get a consultant to come onboard, and discuss those programs. We really hope that we can do

project-based and (indiscernible) based whereas the
voucher (indiscernible) So hopefully if the person can
have this (indiscernible) to get it, and then like Kevin
was speaking, that we could have awarded a consultant by
no later than June.

MS. GREENE: Okay. So can we apply for these-the NOFA I see here that's open on 2/2/24, and it closes
on (indiscernible), 2024?

MS. ESTRADA: Yes, and that, yes, that is open right now, the rental NOFA. (Indiscernible) but the recording is online.

MS. GREENE: Okay.

MS. ESTRADA: And if you have any questions about the NOFA when you're scrolling, you can actually reach out to us --

MS. GREENE: Because I'm actually on your website now.

MS. RINGOLD: I have a question. We're also applying for other rent monies. Does it matter?

MS. ESTRADA: No.

MS. RINGOLD: Okay, okay.

MS. GREENE: Will you have -- do you have 1 2 information about other possible grants (indiscernible). 3 MS. ESTRADA: Right now the Community Catalyst Grant. It's Community Catalyst, CCG. That also will not 4 5 -- they, they actually just opened (indiscernible 0:17:38) that. So they have two forms of grants, and 6 7 that's a capital (indiscernible). So it's -- that's a 8 pretty decent grant. It's not as big as ours. I think 9 you can apply up to the 500,000 for those. Ours apply for a million. But, yes, you guys have (indiscernible) 10 11 to apply (indiscernible). 12 MS. RINGOLD: Okay. 13 MS. ESTRADA: So if you've got any questions 14 once you go through it, (indiscernible) you have to apply 15 online. If you have any questions through the 16 application, you can reach out to (indiscernible). 17 MS. RINGOLD: Okay. Thank you. And your 18 information is on here or --19 MS. ESTRADA: I don't know why it's not on 20 there, but I give it to you. 21 Any other questions?
