4	This is the Affordable Housing Trust Fund Commission
5	meeting for April 23, 2024. We want to call the meeting
6	to order with the roll call.
7	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Commissioner Catherine

1	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Thank you.
2	The meeting is called to order.
3	We want to just vote on the December meeting
4	summary. Any questions concerning the December meeting
5	summary? And if so we can get a motion to accept it.
6	COMMISSIONER HILL: Kevin, you're referring to
7	the February meeting summary, right?
8	PRESIDENT DANIELS: I have the okay. Is it
9	the February? I see on the agenda it's the December.
10	MS. ESTRADA: Oh, that, that shouldn't be
11	right. It should be February.
12	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Oh, okay, good, good. Yes
13	It's the February meeting summary. Can we get a motion?
14	COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: Amy.
15	PRESIDENT DANIELS: I believe moved. And can
16	we get a second?
17	COMMISSIONER HILL: Second.
18	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Properly moved and second.
19	All in favor.
20	MEMBERS: Aye, aye.
21	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any opposed?

1	Any abstentions?
2	The motion carries.
3	We're going to have some DHCD updates.
4	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: It sounds like there was
5	an abstention.
6	PRESIDENT DANIELS: There was?
7	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yes. Tisha Guthrie
8	(indiscernible).
9	COMMISSIONER HILL: Oh, I apologize. I have to
10	abstain too. I'm just now remembering that I was not at
11	this meeting either.
12	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Okay. So we do, so we do
13	have two abstentions from the February, the February
14	meeting, 2024. That's Matt Hill, Commissioner Matt Hill,
15	and Commissioner Tisha Guthrie.
16	Okay, can we get the DHCD updates?
17	MS. ESTRADA: Trying to get those.
18	(indiscernible) not going to share my screen. It's not
19	allowing me to (indiscernible). All right. Here we go.
20	Okay. Let me know if you can see it. Can you all see?
21	PRESIDENT DANIELS: I can.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yes.

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MS. ESTRADA: Perfect, perfect, perfect. All right. Hi everybody. My name is Stephanie Estrada, and I am the program manager for Affordable Housing Trust Fund. Today is the revenue update for -- good through March of 2024. So in the presentation we'll do Trust Fund revenue that was collected for February and March, the commitments and expenditures, and some of the Trust Fund activities.

As of to date, February 2024, we received \$853,605. March 2024 revenue is \$913,439. The revenue collected to date for FY '24 is \$12,356,705. That gives us a total of \$80,692,805 collected since inception.

The revenue contribution type by year for FY '24 is the 7 million City contribution. This has also not been confirmed still. We are still waiting for our Fiscal Department to give us the update on this. We still have not got it. So as of now, we're still going to state it as 7 million.

The tax revenue collected to date is 5.3 million. That gives us a total of 12.3 million.

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The revenue, tax revenue collected to date since inception is \$55,442,800, and the City's contribution is \$25,250,000.

And the commitments and expenditures that are

And the commitments and expenditures that are good through March '24, the CLT has expended 2.1 million. The rental projects have expended 1.5 million. Senior homeownership has expended 6.1 million. Choice neighborhoods 1.5. Rent supplement 1.7. The inclusionary housing 100,000. The Flex Fund has not spent or drawn down. The Pandemic Homelessness has spent all of its funds that was transferred which was 2.7. The administrative cost to date is 2.7 million as well.

These are the projects awarded thus far; 49 projects. 35 are in the middle of term negotiations. 28 point grant agreements have been drafted. Audits reviewed 21. Audits approved 20. BOE requested 20. BOE approved 19. Disbursements 10 and compliance 3.

NOFA information New Construction, Preservation of Existing Rental Housing NOFAs Round 1, 2, 3 and 4 are in the middle of deal structuring and preparing for settlement. Round 5 the NOFA opened February 2, 2024.

1 The deadline for the submission was March 19, 2024. DHCD made up to 7 million available. One million of that 2 3 money was set aside for Community Land Trust rental projects. We received 27 applications. 4 22 of the 27 5 passed threshold, and were forwarded for review. total amount requested is 19,865,000. We hope to make 6 7 award announcements the week of May the 22nd. 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1 | Rental NOFA is -- that was Round 1. That's in the middle

- 2 | of deal structuring. Operating NOFA Round 1, all
- 3 | agreements have been approved by the BOE. Operating NOFA
- 4 | Round 2, the grant agreements have been drafted, and are
- 5 | being submitted for BOE.
- 6 And the Community Land Trust Single-Family
- 7 | Homeownership NOFA Round 4, rolling NOFA opened on
- 8 June 30th. DHCD made up to 4 million available.
- 9 || Community Land Trust projects can request up to
- 10 | one million. The NOFA will run until June 30, 2024, or
- 11 | until the funds run out. If there are funds left, it
- 12 | will roll over to the next fiscal year. Two applications
- 13 | have been submitted. And SHARE Baltimore is continuing
- 14 | to work with CLTs to help with their submissions.
- 15 Long-Term Voucher Program. DHCD posted the RFP
- 16 || to request a consultant for a Long-Term Voucher Program
- 17  $\parallel$  on April the 1st. The link was sent to all the
- 18 | Commissioners. We had the pre-proposal conference on
- 19 | April the 5th. And the deadline to submit proposals to
- 20 | the RFP is April the 29th.
- 21 The Affordable Housing Trust Fund Commission

1 | Bylaws. The first draft has been sent to all the

- 2 | Commissioners for their review. We had our first
- 3 | Commission workgroup meeting to discuss the Bylaws.
- 4 | Commissioner Guthrie suggested that we discuss another
- 5 | governing rules for the Commission other than the Robert
- 6 Rules of Order, and we decided that we would bring that
- 7 | issue here today to Commission meeting.
- 8 For Inclusionary Housing I still have the same
- 9 | update. If there's any Commissioners that want to give
- 10 | additional updates, please do. That's all I know thus
- 11 || far.
- 12 And for Commissioner nominations updates, the
- 13 | Commission is still working with MOHS to identify a
- 14 | representative from the Continuum of Care. And this is
- 15 | the same update. So I don't have any recent updates on
- 16 | this.
- 17 And we can take questions now from the
- 18 | Commissioners.
- 19 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Early on in the PowerPoint
- 20 | you mentioned something about -- you talked about
- 21 | something in the red in the PowerPoint the -- I'm trying

1 to go back and see --2 MS. ESTRADA: Want me to go back to the --3 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Yeah, that first, that 4 first slide. I'm sorry. I wanted to -- you mentioned 5 something -- right there. You mentioned something about 6 the 26 million being that we were -- you said something 7 about a shortfall? Is that what I heard you say? MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. The 7 million contribution 8 9 that's the City's contribution that they give us, it 10 normally takes them some time to confirm the exact amount 11 that the City is able to contribute for the year, but 12 normally we have it by now. But I still do not have an 1.3 update on it. I was told probably last week that I 14 should be getting it shortly but --15 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Okay. 16 MS. ESTRADA: -- I still have not got a 17 confirmation. So once I do then I'll let you all know. 18 COMMISSIONER HARRIS: Okay, yeah. That was my 19 question. 20 But anybody have anything else Commissioners?

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COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yes.

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This is

Commissioner Guthrie. With regards to the City's contribution (indiscernible) taxpayer's night, and from my recollection we will not be getting the seven million. I think it's 4.5 million, something around there. But what I -- the figure I heard was not seven million.

MS. ESTRADA: Okay.

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COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: So it might, it might make sense to review the proposed budget. That might be something that just as a matter of clarification.

MS. ESTRADA: So, we, yeah, we'll -- I'll confirm that with fiscal. So they'll let me know the exact number, but I will confirm, and hopefully by the next meeting I should have some information for you.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Commissioner Tisha, did
they, did they -- well, they didn't address the
7 million. They just -- did they address that it was a
shortfall, the 4 million? Or was that, that the figure
that they gave, the 4 million?

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: That was, yeah, that was just the figure that was provided during the hearing, yes. And just as a matter of inclusion there will be

another hearing on the budget on May 16th. So that

(indiscernible) to attend, and make sure your voice is

heard.

Edwards, and I hadn't heard that it had been -- that it was only going to be the lower amount four point four five million. So I really do want to make sure that we confirm that before we go any further, and discuss the amount because I have not heard that figure. So that's new information. So I just want to make sure that we're -- before we go too far in discussing it we're talking about the correct figures.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Of course.

COMMISSIONER HILL: If I could real quick. So Kate and Stephani, will you work to confirm the -- what the -- similar time when FY '25 is the proposed allocation going to be 7 million or something lower, I quess is the question?

MS. ESTRADA: For right now, no. This is FY '24s. So FY '25 starts after July 1st. So we're still waiting to get confirmation for FY '24. So if she -- and

I guess that's for you Tisha was that stating for FY '25?

Is that the meeting?

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: The City is, is working the Fiscal Year '25 project. So --

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. So that's not -- yeah, that's not what we're discussing. Okay. Okay. So we will -- yeah, we'll definitely follow-up with that. So '25 and '24 but -- yeah. Yeah, '24.

COMMISSIONER HILL: Thank you.

(Simultaneous comments.)

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: So since we're on that topic, so since we're on that topic, what, what timeframe are we working with to get confirmation of what the contribution is it -- for Fiscal Year '24. We're currently meeting about next year's budget.

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. It normally doesn't take that long.

(Simultaneous comments.)

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: I mean --

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. It normally doesn't take this long, but it has been a lot of, of positions being

moved around in the Fiscal Office. So I'm pretty sure 1 2 that's the cause of it. They're running short of staff, 3 and yeah. I think that they're just trying to get that 4 whole thing together. But, yeah, we'll follow-up though. 5 COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Okay. Thank you. 6 COMMISSIONER HILL: I got a quick question too, 7 if I could. MS. ESTRADA: Um-hmm. 8 9 COMMISSIONER HILL: So and Stephani, if you 10 don't mind, if you could turn back to the, the slide, I 11 think it's Slide 7, the March 24 commitments and 12 expenditures. And I think if you don't mind, if you have 1.3 an ability to put it back up there --14 MS. ESTRADA: Um-hmm. 15 COMMISSIONER HILL: -- that would be helpful 16 just because -- thank you. 17 MS. ESTRADA: This one? 18 COMMISSIONER HILL: Thank you.

appreciate it. And I think just like the general

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down has been significantly slower than others. So I know that you're about to make a big award on the rental side, and that will make that amount go up. And for the, the CLT side sounds like there's some movement there, but obviously there's still quite a bit of money in that bucket. And then particularly for Choice Neighborhoods, Rent Supplement, Inclusionary Housing. I don't know if there will be any plan to spend more money on the Inclusionary Housing bucket from that amount allocated given that the studies have all wrapped up, and that the law has passed, and I don't think the law requires some sort of funding from the Trust Fund, the Flex Fund. of those are ones where I'm just -- I'm constantly reminded about the need to get people into affordable housing now. And so I'm just wanting to -- if we can brainstorm for a minute if anyone has ideas about how to expedite moving more of that money more quickly. MS. ESTRADA: I'm open to -- as for the CLT projects and the rental that's, that's the project. So those are actually -- the awards are going out. I think just the expended amount is just based off of real estate

development, and them getting to closing, and, and breaking ground for construction. And once they do that, then we can start drawing down on funds.

For Choice Neighborhoods that's another program, and I, I know that they are -- they're moving, but they, I believe, they have other funds that they're using as well, and then they, they will -- they let me know as they start using the funds in that one.

Rent Supplement, yes, we have the Long-Term

Voucher Program that we would like to use the balance.

And funds can move forward for the Long-Term Voucher

Program.

Inclusionary Housing, I really do not have an update on that. As we begin getting the Spending Plan together I think we'll start making plans for those, those funds when we get the spending -- the FY '25 Spending Plan together which I hope to have that at the June meeting.

Flex Funds, that's another one that it is a possibility to maybe even push that into other buckets of money because we have not made a decision on what we are

going to use the Flex Funds for. It may need to go into Rent Supplement for the Long-Term Voucher Program, but we're open to ideas.

Any comments from the rest of the Commissioners?

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COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yeah, this is Commissioner Guthrie. There are quite a few models that we've talked about, but they just generally speaking there's -- homeless is a, is a growing problem. we've talked about those individuals who are not in need of the wrap-around services, but still in need of (indiscernible) that can be provided to, to keep them out of homelessness. So that to me seems like one of the most immediate ways of using some of these funds. And, obviously, with what's in -- with what's going on across the nation, and what's being heard in the Supreme Court now allowing the communalization of homelessness, I know it's not something that we're immediately dealing with in Baltimore, but the day is today, and we don't know what, what is coming down the pike tomorrow. So if we could really figure out how to use some of these funds to shift

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those or like transition those who no longer need the wrap-around services so that we're freeing up (indiscernible)) those additional services just to keep that pipeline flowing, I think that will be a good use of our efforts.

people who do not need, quote, wrap-around services in our community is there a process to deploy those funds on a coffer that we can tap into or do we need to think about that as well? Because I think your point is a good one, Tisha, that we all make sure that we're doing (indiscernible) organized and efficient, and get some people that are intended.

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: I think that the voucher program that we've -- were -- that we've been talking about would be what would provide the money, unless you're thinking of some other kind of program as well.

But I think that's the program that would help. It's been called in the past the Move On Voucher Program. But would be to provide rent supplements in some form to people who don't necessarily need all of the wrap-around

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services. So I think that that's the program. We just need to get it. That's why we have the RFP that we were -- put out to get that designed because we don't currently have the in-house capacity to (indiscernible).

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yeah. I would just (indiscernible) we've been having (indiscernible) quite some time, and I do appreciate (indiscernible) concern for that being -- that contributing to the timeline that we're currently looking at. But, I mean, quite honestly I'm (indiscernible) what is being done around the country kind of, I mean, there have been whole communities that have burned down like literally in paradise, and within 18 months they got 15 buildings built. It's like we, we -- and I don't (indiscernible) but that's all I have right now. That's the only means by which I can really with some diplomacy express kind of my (indiscernible) the time is for us to get from Point A to Point B. It just it seems like there's not a lot of urgency around this. And based on what (indiscernible) there, there needs to be some urgency. And I get -- by no means am I suggesting that we throw something together or we don't

do our due diligence, but I think that we need to have some kind of timeline.

COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: Right. So maybe that's helpful. Stephani, remind us again the RFP went out in beginning of April. What's the timeline for getting responses back?

MS. ESTRADA: The 29th. Yes. The deadline for them to submit their proposal is the 29th.

COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: 29th?

MS. ESTRADA: Yes, of April.

COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: Oh, April 29th. Okay. And then after that submission of proposals what's the timeline for reviewing and vetting those proposals and making a selection?

MS. ESTRADA: That will probably take between three to four weeks. We have to get a review panel together to review the same as we do as the NOFA, and that normally takes three to four weeks. And then we make the decision on who the consultant will be. And then we have to do the BOE which that takes four to six weeks to get approved by the BOE. And then they, I mean,

they can start working. They just can't start getting
paid until it's BOE approved. So I would say another two
to three months.

COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: Okay. So --

MS. ESTRADA: Consultant to start proposing.

applicants, I think one question would be are you comfortable beginning work prior to BOE approval? So that would mitigate that issue. And then is it possible to include a member of the Commission on the committee that reviews and, you know, a member or more, that reviews the proposals, and provides some support to the

MS. ESTRADA: I'm not sure. I mean, it would be nice to have some addition -- some volunteers to help because we normally have to go out of our department, and get people to volunteer their time to review these proposals, and that sometimes can be challenging. So I would have to ask Kate is it okay for the Commissioners to be on the review panel?

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: We have to figure out

the composition of the review panel. I don't know that we've even figured out how many people we're having and who they are. But I would definitely be open to having one or two Commissioners on the review panel if that makes sense.

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. And I think the size of that review panel just depends on how many proposals we get. So we normally have like for the rental round we have eight people that are reviewing the applications, and that's 22 applications. So I think it just depends on how many --

to see what we get on the 29th. I kind of don't expect us to get as many, you know, for this type of RFP. It's pretty specific, and not the same type at all of what -- you have to have some specialties to be able to do this. So I don't expect to get a large number of responses, but we'll see on the 29th, and then we can figure out how many people we need to have on that review panel. It will be a mixture of internal DHCD people, and then I think having one or two of the Commissioners depending on

the number of applications makes sense.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: One thing, well, two things. One of the suggestions I wanted to make with regards to the summary meeting minutes posted online. I (indiscernible) that when we're speaking acronym that because (indiscernible) but one suggestion I'd like to make is, I mean, it's just -- just usually the proper protocol when we use acronyms like (indiscernible) for the first time just spell it out, and then from there on use the acronym. Because the we're posting things which we want to make sure that they can actually -- that the information is accessible to them. And there may be people trying to get informed who may not, may not have

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that -- haven't been introduced to what the acronym, or these acronyms being. So that's one thing just make the information as accessible as possible. And then more to the point of information that is provided for us, you know, when we made the transition from whatever software program that you were using to provide us with the revenue information to -- from the old to the new, we never really got a tutorial (indiscernible) this new information. And I, I don't know (indiscernible) if we could use -- if we could take a couple (indiscernible) to go over the revenue report, go to the other transactions, and just kind of break down what some of these, these acronyms mean. Because I have no idea.

MS. ESTRADA: Okay.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Ms. Guthrie, I think I missed the missed the first -- Commissioner, I think I missed the first one, your first point. The -- you were talking about the -- when you said the acronyms you were talking about what report?

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: My first comment was really with regard to the minutes that are posted online.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Oh, okay.

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COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Everyone here is familiar with, with NOFA and STICKT (ph.), and these different acronyms means, but when we're posting minutes, as, as many of us have been instructed like if we're making a manual to be trained, you want to make it so that the person off the street who has no idea what your company is doing (indiscernible) they can read it, and they can follow it. And as it stands, I'm not sure that is, that is the, is the case for the minutes that (indiscernible) if you're introducing a community land trust, you write it out, and then in parentheses you just have CLT, and you kind of know from that point on. Community land trust is CLT. Just so people can actually -- it's accessible, you know, the information is accessible, and people know what we're talking about. And then the second part where I mentioned (indiscernible) the transaction report, the spreadsheet,

And then the second part where I mentioned (indiscernible) the transaction report, the spreadsheet, and some of the numbers and the letters that are, that are used. I just, I don't know anything about. I really don't. And I refuse to pretend they're all good. So

Something where in your presentation we have X number of CNI, can we connect it back to the report that you get from Workday? MS. ESTRADA: Well, the report that you're

talking about the tax revenue that comes in.

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that I'm sending you is connected back toward. numbers that's in that line that's rather being to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund calculates out to the total revenue that I report to you every month. So those are the transactions that happen. Tisha is just stating that we have more detail to those transactions. So you're getting the transaction sheet. You're just not getting as much detail as you used to get with the old system. And that would entail that I quess them manually putting that stuff in because clearly it's not coming out like it used to. So I don't know if that is even possible for them to do because that would mean they would have to task -- I don't even know. Like that's a -- again, I'll reach out to them again and ask them, but I don't even know if that's possible because that would just be manually writing it out is, is what it appears to be to me. And then that -- yeah, well, if they break down and send it to me, then that would be great because then I'll just forward it to you, but I don't know if it's possible.
