3	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any opposed?
4	The motion carries.
5	I believe the this is the DHCD updates.
6	MS. ESTRADA: Okay. Hi, everyone. I'm
7	Stephani Estrada. I'm the program manager for the
8	Affordable Housing Trust Fund. Before we get started, we
9	just want to welcome our new employee. Her name is Sadaf
10	Omar, and she will be our compliance officer. Sadaf has
11	technical difficulty today so she can't turn on her
12	camera, but Sadaf just say hello.
13	MS. OMAR: Hi everyone. Happy to join.
14	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Wonderful. Welcome Sadaf.
15	MS. ESTRADA: Yes. All right. So we'll get
16	started with the program revenue updates, and the
17	activities.
18	So as usual we'll go through the revenue, the
19	commitment and expenditures, and the Trust Fund
20	activities.
21	Since we were here in March I have an update

from April's revenue which was \$1,099,743.57. And May's revenue was \$236,731.95.

Revenue collected to date is \$81,529,281.

Revenue collected for FY '24 is \$13,193,181.

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The revenue type by year for FY '24 the City's contribution came in, and that is 6.5 million. The tax revenue collected to date is 6.6 million. And the total for the year again is \$13,193,181.

This is the revenue collected since inception. Tax revenue is \$56,779,276, and the City's contribution is \$24,750,005.

This is commitments and expenditures to date, the CLT and the Rental NOFA had some changes. The CLT has awarded one million, and that was adjusted in the amount awarded and transferred, and the Rental NOFA awarded 8.5 million. So that is the biggest difference in this expenditure from the last time we were here.

The award status overview. We awarded an additional 11 awards which put us at 65 awards to date.

42 of those are in the middle of terms and negotiations.

The grant agreement that has been drafted and sent to the

developers has been 35. 29 have gone through audit review. 29 has been approved by audits. 29 have been requested to BOE. And 24 have been approved.

NOFA information. The New Construction and Preservation of Existing Rental Housing NOFA, Rounds 1, 2, 3 and 4 are all in the middle of deal structuring, presenting agreements to BOE for approval, and preparing for settlement. Round 5, the NOFA opened February 2nd.

The deadline for the submission was March 19, 2024. DHCD made up to seven million available. One million of that money was set aside for Community Land Trust rental projects. We received 27 applications; 22 of the 27 passed threshold, and were forwarded for review. The total amount requested was \$19,865,000. Awardees were notified on June 7th.

The Round 5 awardees was HCH Real Estate

Company, GBAHC, Michaels JV LLC, Severn Development

Company, Baltimore Redlining and Blight Elimination

Community Development Corporation, CSI Support and

Development, Kairos Development, Cherry Hill Development

Corporation, Parity Homes, Women Homes Preservation, Home

for America, and NEHI.

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These awards did come out to 8.5. We had our -- one of the awards from the prior round had rescinded is why we were able to get the additional money to add in a extra project.

Community Land Trust NOFA. The Single-Family
Homeownership NOFAs Round 1, 2 and 3 in the middle of
deal structuring, and presenting agreements for BOE, and
preparing for settlement. The Community Land Trust
Rental NOFA Round 1 is in the middle of deal structuring.

The Operating NOFAs Round 1, all agreements have been approved by the BOE, and majority of the funds have been drawn down.

Operating NOFA Round 2, the grant agreements have been submitted for BOE approval.

Community Land Trust Single-Family

Homeownership NOFA Round 4. The rolling NOFA opened on

June 30, 2023. DHCD made up to four million available.

Community Land Trust projects can request up to one million per project. The NOFA will run until

June 30, 2024, or until the funds run out. If the funds

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are left, it will roll over to the next fiscal year which
will be FY '25. One application has been awarded. SHARE
Baltimore has continued to work with CLTs to help with
their submission. The Community Land Trust awardee that
was awarded was NEHI for another Buyer's Choice in the

Just some Affordable Housing Trust Fund accomplishments. Woodland Gardens II completed construction, and has already leased all of their units.

NEHI has completed its Round 2 project in the process of -- and it is in the process of marketing the homes for sale. NEHI Round 1 Buyer's Choice award is completed which resulted in 10 buyers receiving subsidy to purchase their first home. NEHI Round 2 and Round 3 Buyer's Choice have started granting subsidy awards to buyers.

Round 2 will help another 10 buyers, and Round 3 will help 15 buyers purchase homes.

Long-Term Voucher Program. DHCD posted the RFP to request a consultant for a Long-Term Voucher Program on April the 1st. The link was sent to all Commissioners. We had the pre-proposal conference on

1 | April the 5th. The deadline to submit proposals was

- 2 | April the 29th. We received five applications. The
- 3 | Review Panel met two times to discuss the applications.
- 4 | DHCD has made a decision, and notified the awardees. The
- 5 | Long-Term Voucher consultant awardee is Enterprise
- 6 | Community Partners.
- 7 | The Affordable Housing Trust Fund Commission
- 8 Bylaws. Again the first draft has been sent to all the
- 9 | Commissioners for their review. We've had multiple
- 10 | conversations on how we will proceed to draft bylaws that
- 11 | is right for our Board, but we really need you all to
- 12 | kind of respond to your availability so that we can
- 13 discuss this further in a workgroup.
- 14 | Inclusionary housing. I do not have any
- 15 | updates on this. It's the same. If there are any
- 16 | Commissioners that is on the call that want to give an
- 17 | update, you can at the end of this update.
- 18 | Commissioner nominations. We received an
- 19 | application from Matt Hill for the CLT representative,
- 20 | and it has been submitted for review.
- 21 And that is it. I'll keep it up just in case

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1 you want me to go back to any pages, but we can -- I can 2 take questions now.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Yeah. Let me ask the, and I know we talked about that before, but the -- around the first slide where we talked about the City's contribution, that six million, I know we talked about this before but the -- it's not the -- I saw the six million, but I didn't see -- is it towards the end of the quarter that they add that their contribution in? I can't remember. But it's glaring in, in I think it was that it was six million, and I didn't see -- is that the normal contribution every, every year?

MS. ESTRADA: It's between 6.5 and 7 million that I've been seeing regularly now. So normally we do get updates a little sooner than we have for FY '24, but I think it's because of the change in employment in the Fiscal Office is probably what delayed this year. I have already got an update for FY '25 that we will be receiving 6.5 in FY '25. So I just think it was probably that in between stage of them coming in and out. So, yes, but the, the number to get is normally seven

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PRESIDENT DANIELS: Oh, okay, okay. I just
thought that that -- I said it I saw it. I know we've
had discussions about it before, and I just saw that. I
saw that, and I wanted to just, just have some thoughts

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: This is Commissioner

Guthrie.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Yes, ma'am.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Thank you Stephani for the presentation and the information. If you wouldn't mind going back to the, the slide indicating the, the revenue from May, April, and then I guess it was March.

MS. ESTRADA: I got you. Yes.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yes. So I don't recall the breakdown in March or April, but I'm wondering, I mean, this is a huge, a huge disparity between those, these months, especially like from April to May. I'm just wondering if, if anyone has any kind of explanation as to what could be causing that, that big gap.

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MS. ESTRADA: I don't. Kate is on the call 1 2 now. Kate would know what would be the issue on why the 3 numbers are drastically different. COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: I'm joining you -- phone 4 5 right now so I can't see it, but is this the revenue --MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. 6 7 (Simultaneous comments.) COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: -- from April to May? 8 9 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. So April was 1,099,000, 10 and May was 236,000. 11 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: I mean, it's probably 12 just transactions that occurred --1.3 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. 14 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: -- in those months 15 (indiscernible) transactions over a million dollars --16 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. 17 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: -- just could have been 18 more of those transactions that was higher. 19 COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Right. Okay. Okay. 20 The other, other thing I wanted to mention is with 21 regards to the inclusionary housing. And so where we are

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right now is of course everyone knows that the bill passed. It's officially law. And there, there has been nominees presented or submitted as potential members for the Inclusionary Housing Board, but we are currently in a holding pattern, and there is a timeframe by which they're supposed to be onboard, vetted, and seated, and we are past that. So I wanted to bring that to the attention of the Board, especially being that -- being Commissioners on this Board we understand the importance of being an advocacy activist, whatever position, and having that as part of the process. There's really no work that can be done until we have, at least from what I understand, there's very little work that can be done until we have that Board seated, and the proper representation in line. So I really wanted, I wanted to bring that to the Commission as something to be informed on. PRESIDENT DANIELS: And that's -- what is the

-- just a question. What is the -- what's been some of the, again, some of the challenges that -- as far as seating, seating the Board?

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: So we just, we, we
the Inclusionary Housing Coalition which was
quarterbacked by Councilperson Odette Ramos, and which
works diligently to get the law passed. We submitted
the, the nominees to the appropriate entities, namely,
DHCD and the Mayor's Office. And we really can't do
anything until those parties make a move, and we're just
kind of in this holding pattern. And it's it really
is very important to be able to chew gum and walk at the
same time. I definitely understand that there's a lot
going on in the City. We just had a primary election,
and it
but this was in two years. I mean, this is we
waited for two years to get this law passed, and we
the City really cannot wait much longer to put things in
place, and to make sure that this inclusionary housing
law is a part of this affordable housing pipeline.
So the more we can actually get in place so
that we can ensure that this law acts and functions as we
are hoping it does the better off the City of Baltimore.
So I just felt like everyone needed to be informed as

2 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Commissioner Kate.

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Well, I was one of the

-- I was in a meeting (indiscernible) yesterday where
they were going over the kind of the program guidelines,
and to my understanding they're still getting things up
and going which should be in place very soon. So I think
that things are moving along, and I think it will make
sense for us to have a full update at the next commission
meeting of the progress has been made. I'm not sure if
we're at that point. (Indiscernible) people who are
actually more involved and directly working on it, but I
think it would make sense to get that update on where we
are overall with implementing.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Okay. And, Kate, if there is, if there is work being done, and -- is it possible to get those parties who have been really a part of this whole process to get them updated? Because as -- (Simultaneous comments.)

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: That's exactly what I mean.

1	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: nobody's been
2	(Simultaneous comments.)
3	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: haven't been kept in
4	the loop.
5	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Right. That's what I'm
6	proposing.
7	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Yeah.
8	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Is to have the people
9	who are actually more involved who actually were working

L1	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Okay.
L2	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: give an update at the
L3	next meeting.
L 4	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Thank you.
L5	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Um-hmm.
L 6	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any other Commissioners
L7	questions?
L 8	COMMISSIONER HILL: Yes. Hi. This is Matt
L 9	Hill. A few quick questions. First, for maybe for the
20	next meeting if it's possible I'd like to check in on the
21	issue of how much money is being spent on 30 percent AMI

units versus 50 percent AMI units. I think the charter, 1 if I remember correctly, says that half the money should 3 be spent on 30 percent AMI units. I'm just wondering where we are on, on that metric.

Then the -- I don't know if there's going to be a proposal on the FY '25 budget for the Trust Fund. thought -- I was kind of expecting that at this meeting, but I could have been mistaken.

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah, no. I'm going to have it by the July meeting.

COMMISSIONER HILL: Okay, great.

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12 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. I'm just waiting on 13 approvals is all.

14 COMMISSIONER HILL: Got it. Cool.

And then Ms. Blake she submitted, and I forwarded it to you all, and I know you mention in your PowerPoint, I appreciate that. Do we have any sense on timeline? Just because it's been quite a long time since, since Anthony passed away, and there's been nobody representing folks who experienced homelessness on this Commission. I think it's an important role, and so I'm

application. I know it's not all on you all. I know

it's the Mayor's Office who shepherds these things, but

5 MS. ESTRADA: Yes. I can follow-up with them 6 for sure.

COMMISSIONER HILL: Thank you. And then I think this is my last one. On the voucher consultant appreciate that that was that that took place, and I -- full disclosure, I got to be a part of the Review Panel which was fantastic. So thanks for including me. And I think Enterprise is a solid choice.

Do we have a sense on when they're going to start their work, and what the timeframe is on completing it and all of that? I just -- that's another one where I'm just really anxious to move it forward.

MS. ESTRADA: Well, firstly, we're about to do a kickoff meeting with them to get our first introductory meeting with them, and then we'll start prepping the contract to go through BOE. So that takes a little bit of time. That's probably 6 to 8 weeks for sure. And

1 | then I'm not -- I can't remember off the top of my head,
2 | but I believe that their timeline was within 12 months.

COMMISSIONER HILL: Okay. Great. I think it would be, it would be helpful as part of -- I know there's some information gathering and outreach. Maybe inviting them to come to one of these Commission meetings, yeah. So we just so we can have some participation on that, on that process.

MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. Because they -- that's a part of the proposal was for them to attend some of the Commission meetings --

COMMISSIONER HILL: Okay.

MS. ESTRADA: -- to update you all on the progress and stuff. So, yes, once we get started that absolutely will happen.

COMMISSIONER HILL: Great. Thank you.

PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any other dialog

I don't -- yeah, we don't normally do that part, but we've been trying to get more involved with this especially since like Matt sent me over an application. So we're trying to get involved with it to see if we can get better updates on it. So I'll make a note of that as well.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: I mean, would it be helpful if we submitted something to the Mayor's Office? Because like again it's --

MS. ESTRADA: Sure.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: -- been awhile.

MS. ESTRADA: Sure, absolutely. And if you have any referrals, you can do like, like Matt had did it, submit it to us, and we can get it to them. But, yeah, absolutely, you can reach out to the Mayor's Office.

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: All right. Thank you.
