4	the Affordable Housing Trust Fund Commission meeting
5	December 12, 2023.

4	I want to take a look at the October meeting
5	summary; if there are any questions, comments. I do want
6	to I want to make note that I was present for that
7	meeting. It does state that I was a part of, of course,
8	the call to order at 6:10, but I just wanted to make sure
9	we just note the members present.
10	Do we have any questions before we do move a
11	motion?
12	Can we get a motion for the minutes October 24,
13	2023?
14	COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: I motion for adoption.
15	COMMISSIONER JONES: Second.
16	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Properly moved and second.
17	All I favor.
18	COMMISSIONERS: Aye, aye, aye.
19	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any oppose?
20	Any abstentions?
21	Motion carries.

1	On the agenda we have the DHCD updates. And
2	Staci is on she's online.
3	Let the record show she's present.
4	(Indiscernible comments.)
5	MS. ESTRADA: Okay. Hi everyone.
6	Stephani Estrada, Program Manager for the Affordable
7	Housing Trust Fund, and this is December revenue update
8	(indiscernible) and revenue update.
9	First will be the Trust Fund revenue, the
LO	commitments and expenditures, and then following that
L1	housing the Trust Fund activity.
L2	First, our last revenue since we came in in
L3	September our we didn't have October and November's
L 4	numbers. So we'll talk about the revenue for that.
L5	October, we actually received \$1.154 million for that
L 6	month. So that's great. November's month was 451,000.
L7	COMMISSIONER JONES: I have a question. What
L 8	was the cause for that massive upswing in revenue in
L 9	MS. ESTRADA: I'm not sure. But after the
20	updates we do questions of Commissioners.
21	COMMISSIONER JONES: Okay.

1	MS. ESTRADA: As of to date, FY '24, we have
2	received \$9,670,405. This includes the current
3	contribution from the City which is 7 million, and that
4	has not fully been confirmed yet. The total amount,
5	the to date, is \$78,000,006.00 \$6,506.
6	This is the contribution type by year. For
7	this year, FY '24, we had City contribution of 7 million.
8	It's actually 2 million. I'm sorry. My, my numbers on
9	that is wrong. So it's \$2,670,406.
10	The funding source revenue amount to date
11	PRESIDENT DANIELS: Have a question.
12	MS. ESTRADA: the tax revenue say it
13	again.
14	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: I was just trying to
15	understand what you were saying was for, but that's okay.
16	MS. ESTRADA: Oh (indiscernible)?
17	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Yeah.
18	MS. ESTRADA: My revenue
19	COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Oh, so that should be
20	2 million
21	MS. ESTRADA: Yeah.

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Still 7 million 1 2 contribution from the --3 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. Still showing 7 million for the contribution. And this is to cover the tax 4 5 revenue that we received this year. So it's \$2,670,406. But that number is off right there for that. I didn't 6 7 change this on the (indiscernible). We got 9 million. This is 7 million. So our 8 tax revenue that we received to date is 2 million. 9 10 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Okay. 11 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah (indiscernible). 12 COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Sorry. 13 MS. ESTRADA: Okay. Revenue amount collected 14 to date since inception is \$52,756,501. The City 15 contribution is up to \$25,250,000. And, again, the 16 7 million has not been confirmed; so that number may 17 change. 18 This is the commitments and expenditures, and 19 this number has a -- for this one I'm going to go through 20 the things that have a drastic difference because these 21 numbers don't change as fast as some of the other

numbers. But some of the differences is your Senor

Homeownership. We now are up to 5.4 million that serves

336 households at 30 percent AMI. Also Pandemic Homeless

Fund the 2.75 million has been spent to date. We got the

numbers for that. And that served 494 households, and

all of them were at 30 percent AMI.

This is the status overview of our projects that are moving along. We have 49 projects. So far 35 have gone through due diligence in terms of (indiscernible). Our grant agreement that we drafted so far is 28. 21 have gone through audit review. 20 have been approved by audit. 20 have been requested by BOE. 18 have been approved by BOE. 10 are in disbursement status, and 3 in compliance.

These are just the overview of -- we had this from our last update, and this is just the capital projects that are one under construction, and some of the projects that will start construction in the 12 months.

NOFA. Our Rental NOFA Rounds 1, 2 and 3 are still deal structuring, and we're presenting (indiscernible) BOE every day, and we're preparing for

settlement. Round 4 we're deal structuring. Again

(indiscernible) with the BOE, and preparing for

settlement also. Round 5 is coming out. Rental NOFA is

up right now for public comment. The public comments

will be accepted until December the 19th. We did send an

e-mail out to all the Commissioners with the link that

you can send out to anyone who wants to comment on it.

The proposed launch date for the NOFA is

February the 2nd. DHCD will make up the 7 million

available; 1 million of that money will be set aside for

Community Land Trust rental projects.

Community Land Trust, Single-Family

Homeownership NOFA, Round 1 and 2 and 3 is deal

structuring, present agreements to BOE, and preparing for settlement.

Community Land Trust, Rental NOFA, is in the middle of deal structuring. The Operating NOFA, Round 1, all agreements have been approved by the BOE. The Operating NOFA for Round 2, applications open on the 29th. Deadline for applications was October 6th. The CLT applicants requested up to 100K. Four applications

have been received and approved for award. Take-off meetings are being scheduled now.

Community Land Trust, Single-Family

Homeownership NOFA Round 4 that's a rolling NOFA which

opened on June 30th. DHCD made up the 4 million

available. Community Land Trust projects can request up

to 1 million. The NOFA will run until June 30, 2024, or

until the funds run out. If funds don't run out, they

will roll over to the next FY bucket of money. No

applications have been submitted yet. And SHARE

Baltimore is working with CLTs to help with their

submissions.

Long-Term Voucher Program. The Commission workgroup for the Long-Term Voucher Program met again on November the 14th to discuss the next steps. DHCD has decided to put a RFP out for a consultant to help make a decision on what type of Long-Term Voucher Program we go with, and that's the (indiscernible) base or both. After we make a decision we will put out another RFP for organizations that will be able to administer the type of Long-Term Voucher Program we decide on. We will begin to

draft the RFP at the beginning of the year, and we'll circle around in the workgroup for review to get the Commission's input before posting it.

Sent to all Commissioners for their review. We do need more volunteers for the workgroup to work through what was delivered. And after the review by the Commission, we can add or make, you know, add or make other suggestions to add to it. So far I have volunteers for Kevin Daniels. I believe Amy you said that you would be a part of this workgroup, but you can confirm after the

COMMISSIONER MCCLAIN: Yes.

MS. ESTRADA: So I'll add you on as one, and if we have anyone else that wants to be a part of that workgroup, please let me know.

The Inclusionary Housing. I do not have any updates on this.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Stephani --

MS. ESTRADA: Uh-huh.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Stephani on that part

1 | could you try and (indiscernible) as of the beginning of 2 | the year?

MS. ESTRADA: Yes, that's fine.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible).

6 | Inclusionary Housing. I don't have any updates for this.

7 | The last meeting we had Tisha Guthrie and Matt speak

8 | towards it. If there's any updates that the Commission

9 want to give, you can.

(Simultaneous indiscernible comments.)

MS. ESTRADA: Yes, you can. Go ahead.

14 COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Okay. So Matt and I are

15 | glad to announce that we now have -- it will be signed in

16 | January which will be our hearing, but we have passed --

17 | the Inclusionary Housing Bill has been passed after 22

18 | months of hard work. And we are looking to move forward,

19 | and with an Inclusionary Housing Bill as part of one of

20 | the many tools in our tool kit to include or increase the

21 | amount of affordability when it comes to housing in

- 1 | Baltimore. So we are ecstatic.
- 2 MS. ESTRADA: Thank you. Thank you for your
- 3 | update.
- 4 Okay. Commissioner nomination updates. The
- 5 | Commissioners working with MOHS to identify
- 6 | representative from the CLC. For the other position I do
- 7 | not have an update for that.
- 8 | Questions.
- 9 | (Indiscernible simultaneous comments.)
- 10 COMMISSIONER HILL: I'm just trying to be
- 11 | polite. Go ahead Tisha or Bree.
- 12 COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Oh, no. I was going to
- 13 | bring up Bree's question.
- 14 You can go first.
- 15 COMMISSIONER HILL: Okay. All right. Remind
- 16 | me what the position is. Is this the renter below a
- 17 | certain income level?
- 18 MS. ESTRADA: Yes. It was Iletha's position.
- 19 | I think that was below 50 percent.
- 20 COMMISSIONER HILL: Okay.
- 21 MS. ESTRADA: -- yes.

COMMISSIONER HILL: All right. We'll look 1 2 again --3 MS. ESTRADA: Yes. If you have anybody, please refer them 4 COMMISSIONER HILL: I can join the bylaw work 5 6 group. Please sign me up there. 7 COMMISSIONER JONES: You sound so excited. COMMISSIONER HILL: So the Long-Term Voucher 8 9 Program. I appreciate the Department moving forward to 10 make that a reality. I think that's super important, 11 especially for reaching folks who are homeless or 12 extremely low income. I know I sound like a broken 13 record, but I just got to keep -- and I appreciate, you 14 know, that the RFP will hopefully go out in January it 15 sounds like. Is that the goal? 16 MS. ESTRADA: I don't know -- around January. 17 That's when I'm going to start preparing for it though. 18 COMMISSIONER HILL: Okay. 19 MS. ESTRADA: Yeah. I'm going to prepare it, 20 and circulate around, and then once we, we'll probably 21 have it in one of our workgroups hopefully maybe by

January's workgroup. Then we will talk about it, and kind of square it up. So I would probably say like late
February maybe early March.

COMMISSIONER HILL: Got it. Okay. And maybe when we have that workgroup too if DHCD could just present some ideas about when we think we could actually get a program up and running. Because now it sounds like there's going to be a separate RFP after the RFP to pick who is going to administer --

MS. ESTRADA: Right.

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COMMISSIONER HILL: -- or help administer the program. So I understand why. I totally get that. But the timeframe is just it's challenging because there is roughly \$3 million maybe in the bank, and lots of folks without housing. So if there's any way DHCD could come up with some way to expedite the timeline or propose an expedited timeline I'm happy to help however I can, but it's just really concerning to me.

MS. ESTRADA: Okay.

COMMISSIONER JONES: I have a question following that. Can you explain a little bit of the

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tenant based?

nuance between like I know the difference between project based and tenant based, but why we need a consultant?

Like what are the things that we're looking for the consultant to clarify in terms of either project based of

MS. ESTRADA: I don't know.

I think we need a consultant not just to answer that question. The consultant is really to help us figure out how do we structure a program in general, but we do want them to dig a little bit into those two current models. So right now there's the Move-On model that has been presented in the past, and that model is a tenant-based model that is specifically for people who are ready to leave permanent supportive housing. And so that's one model that has been explored. Project-based, we looked at because we would love it to be able to support the construction money that we're already putting into projects. And so we would like to be able to offer a local voucher because some of these projects can't get the vouchers from HABC. And so that's why think project

based is a good thing to look at too. And maybe it turns out that we do some of both or something like that. But we ended up talking with Baltimore Regional Housing

5 COMMISSIONER HILL: Partnership.

Project.

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Partnership. I keep getting --

(Simultaneous comments.)

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: -- get that right.

Anyway, in talking to them it just -- we realize how much more detailed this really is going to be, and we don't have that, the expertise, to put together the project, and we want it to be a good project, and one that we can run smoothly. And so we don't think we can just rush it, and just try and put it out there, make all these decisions without having that -- a full background report, somebody who has more expertise. So that's why we want a consultant.

COMMISSIONER JONES: Got it. And then my second question is I know that historically HABC had run this program. So is it in pipe that it's now going to

1 | come under DHCD?

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COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Well, no. So they will

be two different things. HABC runs federal voucher

programs that's federally funded, and has very specific

federal rules that have to be followed. This would be a

local voucher program that would complement that, but not

be the same as that.

8 | COMMISSIONER JONES: Okay. And what's the,
9 | what is the local voucher called? Is it --

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: We haven't named it yet.

11 COMMISSIONER JONES: Okay. So this is the 12 creation of a whole new voucher system?

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Um-hmm, yes.

COMMISSIONER JONES: Okay, got it.

15 PRESIDENT DANIELS: Any other questions?

COMMISSIONER GUTHRIE: Well, I just wanted to bring up initially what Bree had a question on which is the disparity for the, the flux in revenue between

19 || September, October, November.

COMMISSIONER EDWARDS: Probably just some big transaction (indiscernible) revenue from real estate

transactions over a million dollars, and so they're
probably just -- must have been a few big transactions
that (indiscernible).

COMMISSIONER HILL: Do we still get -- I didn't have a chance to look at my e-mail today, but there's actually like a list of each project, how much they contribute. Was that --

MS. ESTRADA: The revenue report.

COMMISSIONER HILL: The revenue report.

MS. ESTRADA: So we get it, and Crystal can send it to you because they, they give (indiscernible), but it's not as detailed as we used to --

COMMISSIONER HILL: Right.

MS. ESTRADA: -- they transferred over to work day which you guys may have noticed when we sent it out.

It's like -- it just says cash sales versus before it had the address. It had the, the, like, tax money that was sent out. Now it showed what we get from the (indiscernible), but it's very light generally. It's not very detailed at all. So, yes, we will be sending that out to you because we actually literally just got it like
